The settings E Safety Champion is responsible for highlighting the risks posed by the internet to the children, staff and families that attend Summertime.

The settings E Safety Champion is: Tash King

The E Safety Champion will ensure that they continue to update their own knowledge and expertise with regards to the dangers of using the internet. The champion will also be responsible for taking the lead to develop and review the E Safety policy. They will regularly visit e-safety sites for the latest advice and information and make any amendments to the policy as required.

The E Safety champion will also use the settings newsletters to highlight the dangers and benefits to the families using the setting when necessary.

New staff, volunteers and existing staff will be made aware of e-safety issues. They will be highlighted during the induction process, at supervisions, staff meetings, training sessions and through the policies and procedures of the setting. The committee will also be made aware of the E Safety policy and any changes taking place.

Children will learn about the risks and benefits of using the internet through activities such as stranger danger, or by using ICT linked to the website to play educational games or finding information.

Children will always be closely monitored when using the I pads and computers in the classrooms to avoid the accessing any inappropriate sites.

The setting will also access online compass, this is a simple tool that shows you what you need to do to make the use of technology safer for your group. You can
